





COMMITTEE REPORTS

Conference and Awards Committee

FASD is thankful for our outstanding speakers, presenters, members, sponsors, and exhibitors who worked with us on the 2023 Annual Conference! We would like to express our gratitude for their invaluable contributions and unwavering commitment to the success of the conference. Your dedication and expertise have been instrumental in shaping the program and ensuring a memorable experience for all participants.

Legislative Committee

The Legislative Committee, in collaboration with Ramba Consulting Group, Laura Jacobs Donaldson, and Chris Lyon, achieved success in advancing FASD's priority legislation. Notably, this included the inclusion of trespass language to address issues of unlawful dumping, as well as the implementation of delaying performance reviews by the fire districts impacted by Hurricane Ian.

We strongly recommend reviewing the final legislative report for further details on specific bills that were passed during this session, relating to our focus areas. This report is forthcoming.



COMMITTEE REPORTS

Finance and Strategic Committee

The committee served as an oversight team for FASD by providing recommendations and feedback as to the impact of financial matters, budget preparation, expenditures, revenue projections and investments. Committee members provided detailed guidance and leadership to the association's Board with enabled FASD to be fiscally responsible and operate in accordance with State guidelines.

Education and Certification Committee

The Education and Certification Committee continues to expand FASD's outreach with respected certification programs and training. Committee members worked monthly to provide guidance on the future of a new certification program as well as increasing the amount of continuing education hours to conference attendees. The committee anticipates further expansion of education opportunities in the new year!



COMMITTEE REPORTS

Membership and Technology Committee

The committee worked diligently together to update and modernize our membership levels, aligning them with the evolving demands and expectations of the 21st century. As a result, there will be revisions to the upcoming membership dues.

We kindly request that you remain attentive for these vital updates.

Nominating Committee

This smaller committee oversees the FASD membership to identify eligible candidates who can be considered for available positions on the Board of Directors while ensuring representation across membership categories.

This year, the committee faced a significant task, resulting in the appointment of 11 new members to the FASD Board of Directors, including 4 individuals who are entirely new to the board.



CERTIFICATION REPORT

Certified District Manager

Since the inaugural class of CDMs in 2005, a total of 203 candidates have participated in the CDM Program. Currently, there are 117 individuals who have successfully obtained their CDM certification. Out of the 117 certified CDMs, 42 of them are due for renewal this year. Since the fall of 2021, the CDM Program has welcomed 79 new candidates. On Thursday, we will be awarding certificates to 15 deserving candidates.

Certified District Official

Since the inception of CDO certification courses in 2007, a total of 98 individuals have successfully completed the program and obtained their certification. Currently, there are 57 professionals who hold the certified CDO designation. Furthermore, we currently have 32 applicants seeking CDO certification.

STATE ADVOCACY



DESANTIS EXERCISES VETO POWER; TRIMS FLORIDA BUDGET FOR 2023-2024

Governor Ron DeSantis of Florida has wielded his veto power to strike down certain provisions within the state budget for the fiscal year 2023-2024. With an eye toward fiscal responsibility and prioritizing key areas, the governor's veto actions have aimed to streamline the budget and ensure effective allocation of resources. Here's a summary of the notable items Governor DeSantis has vetoed.

— EDUCATION: In the realm of education, Governor DeSantis exercised his veto pen to eliminate certain funding proposals. The budget initially included appropriations for new school construction projects, but the governor vetoed a significant portion of these funds.

The rationale behind the veto was to focus on maintaining existing school facilities and bolstering educational programs and initiatives rather than expanding infrastructure.

- INFRASTRUCTURE AND TRANSPORTATION: While infrastructure remains a key priority for the state, Governor DeSantis made strategic cuts in certain transportation-related projects. While preserving critical healthcare funding, the governor vetoed specific proposals to ensure responsible spending. This approach allows for a more focused allocation of resources, prioritizing essential healthcare services and initiatives that align with the state's long-term goals.

- ENVIRONMENT AND **CONSERVATION:** Recognizing the importance of environmental preservation and conservation, Governor DeSantis took care to strike a balance between responsible budgeting and environmental stewardship. The governor vetoed certain funding allocations that were deemed excessive or unnecessary, ensuring that taxpayer dollars are directed towards the most impactful environmental initiatives. including conservation efforts and protecting the state's natural resources.

Governor Ron DeSantis wielded his veto power to carefully curtail certain provisions within the Florida state budget for the fiscal year 2023-2024. By selectively vetoing items in the budget, the governor sought to prioritize key areas such as education, infrastructure, healthcare, and the environment. 

WHY RELYING SOLELY ON FACEBOOK CAN BE PROBLEMATIC

Every day we talk to districts across the country that use Facebook as their primary (and often only) online presence.

Let's check out 3 things to consider when using Facebook as the primary online presence:

1. Not everyone has a Facebook account. According to a 2021 survey by the Pew Research Center, only 69% of American adults use Facebook, and the number of users is decreasing daily. This means that by relying solely on Facebook, districts are excluding a significant portion of their constituents from accessing important information and updates.

Additionally, even for those who do have a Facebook account, it can be challenging to navigate and find the information they need. Facebook's algorithm typically prioritizes content based on engagement, which means that important updates from local governments can easily get lost in users' newsfeeds. This can create a situation where crucial information is missed by residents, leading to confusion and frustration.

- 2. Facebook is not a reliable source of information. Facebook's terms of service state that the company cannot guarantee the accuracy of the information shared on its platform. This means that districts run the risk of sharing inaccurate information, which can have serious consequences for their constituents and impact the credibility of the district. Or in a worst-case scenario, one port district in California was shocked to find out that a Facebook page with their name on it was posting about a beer festival. After some investigating, they determined that a resident created a false Facebook page and was posting updates as the district, but the community had no way of knowing that it was a fake account.
- **3. Relying on Facebook can lead to issues with transparency and accountability.** Unlike a government website, which is owned and managed by the government itself, Facebook is a third-party platform. This means that districts have less control over how their information is presented and shared. Additionally, Facebook's algorithm determines which posts are shown to users, which can create a situation where important updates are not seen by residents. If the community can't see it, they won't know you're doing it. And because Facebook is a social media platform, there is nowhere to reliably share important documents like agendas, minutes, and budgets all of which are crucial in building trust and credibility with the community.

Instead of relying on Facebook alone, districts should focus on building a robust online presence that includes a website, social media platforms, and other digital channels that are accessible to all community members.

ADA Emergency Planning

Working to protect the public from emergencies and disasters such as storms and other weather events is known as Emergency Management.

Local governments have a responsibility to prepare for, respond to and recover from emergencies and disasters. Emergency Management programs must follow the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) guidelines, which ensures their programs do not discriminate against people with disabilities.

Examples of the programs within Emergency Management plans include:

- Emergency shelter programs
- Community evacuation and transportation
- · Emergency alerts

Temporary shelter during an emergency is something that local governments usually supply and are responsible for. The ADA requires shelters to offer persons with disabilities equal access to these services as well as their benefits such as safety, food and medical care.

Local governments may need to make modifications to their Emergency Management programs and services. These modifications or changes should be reasonable and always be clearly defined.

Physical accessibility to the shelter is a strong consideration. Along these lines, a physical survey of the shelter spaces should be made to ensure they comply with ADA Standards.

- Accessible routes, no trip hazards and wheelchair navigable
- Entrances/exits/doorways must be wide enough to accommodate wheelchairs and scooters, if acceptable
- Sleeping area accommodates for any equipment needed to assist the disabled person
- Shower/sinks/toilets accommodate for disabled individuals and any assistance that they need
- · Dining areas; Recreational areas; Parking
- Emergency exits

The Importance of Tracking Near Miss Incidents

According to the National Safety Council, for every 100 accidents that occur, there are 300 near misses. For every single serious accident that happens, there are 300 opportunities to prevent it from happening and that is a huge opportunity.

Tracking near misses is an important part of any comprehensive safety program. By tracking near misses, districts can identify potential hazards and address problems head-on before they lead to accidents where injuries or property damage may occur. A near miss is an unplanned or unexpected event that has the potential to cause harm to people, property, or the environment. Near misses are often overlooked, but they can provide valuable insights into potential hazards and risks.

Here are some examples of near misses:

- A board meeting attendee almost slips and falls on a wet floor in a meeting space.
- A district employee almost cuts himself with a utility knife while breaking down boxes.

- A district employee almost gets struck by flying debris during landscaping.
- A district volunteer almost makes a mistake with cleaning chemicals that could have caused a serious accident.
- A district field operations manager almost falls when retrieving a shelved item stored in a maintenance shed.
- A district employee almost touches a live electrical wire.

There are many benefits to tracking near misses. First, it can help to improve safety culture. When employees feel comfortable reporting near misses, it shows that they trust their managers and supervisors to take action to prevent future accidents. This can lead to a more initiative-taking approach to safety, one where employees are constantly looking for ways to improve safety procedures and practices.

Second, tracking near misses can help to identify and address potential hazards. By analyzing near misses, districts can identify the root causes of potential problems. This information can then be used to implement changes to policies, procedures, equipment, or training to prevent future accidents.

Third, tracking near misses can help to reduce a district's total cost of risk.

By tracking near misses and taking steps to prevent accidents through the knowledge gained, organizations can demonstrate that they are proactively committed to safety, not just reacting when accidents occur. By lowering the frequency and severity of accidents, the district's claim or loss experience is reduced making them a more desirable risk to insure (thereby saving money).

How to Track Near Misses Effectively

There are several ways to track near misses effectively. The most important step is to create a clear culture in your district where employees feel comfortable reporting near misses, no matter how minor they seem to be. Messaging and perception are key here. This can be done by providing employees with training on the importance of reporting near misses and by creating a system for reporting near misses that is easy to use. Of course, reporting can range from filling out a card and dropping it in a box or completing an online form that automatically fills a spreadsheet or database.

To set up a near miss reporting process, a district can create a near miss reporting form. The form should include the following basic information:

- Date and time of the near miss
- Location of the near miss
- · Description of the near miss
- Operations or tasks being done at the time
- · Names of any witnesses

Once a system for reporting near misses is in place, it is important to investigate each near miss and analyze the data that is collected.

Investigating near miss incidents should carry the same weight and importance as investigating accidents and injuries. This data can be used to identify potential hazards, track trends, and measure the effectiveness of safety initiatives. Again, using technology like simple spreadsheets, apps or databases to help identify trends speeds analysis and aids the district in efficiently administering the program.

It is also important to take demonstrable action on the data collected to address near misses in a way that is readily apparent to all members. This may involve implementing changes to policies, procedures, equipment, or training. By taking action to address near misses, organizations and districts can prevent accidents and improve overall safety.

Additional tips for tracking near misses effectively:

- Make sure that employees understand the definition of a near miss and the importance of tracking.
- Provide employees with a variety of ways to report near misses, such as completing cards, online forms, phone calls, or email.
- Use near miss data to improve safety policies, procedures, equipment, and training.






- Keep near miss reports confidential (and even anonymous). As with incident reports, near miss reports could happen to anyone so there should not be the tendency to assign blame but rather find root causes and fix them (which helps encourage reporting).
- Investigate all near misses and take clear action to prevent future accidents. Share the knowledge gained from these reports regularly.

We have all had situations where we have felt that lump in our throat after experiencing a near miss or said to ourselves: "Whew, that could've been bad." If we collectively embrace a system of identifying and resolving or managing the risks before they manifest in an injury, accident, or property damage – it makes your district safer for everyone.


